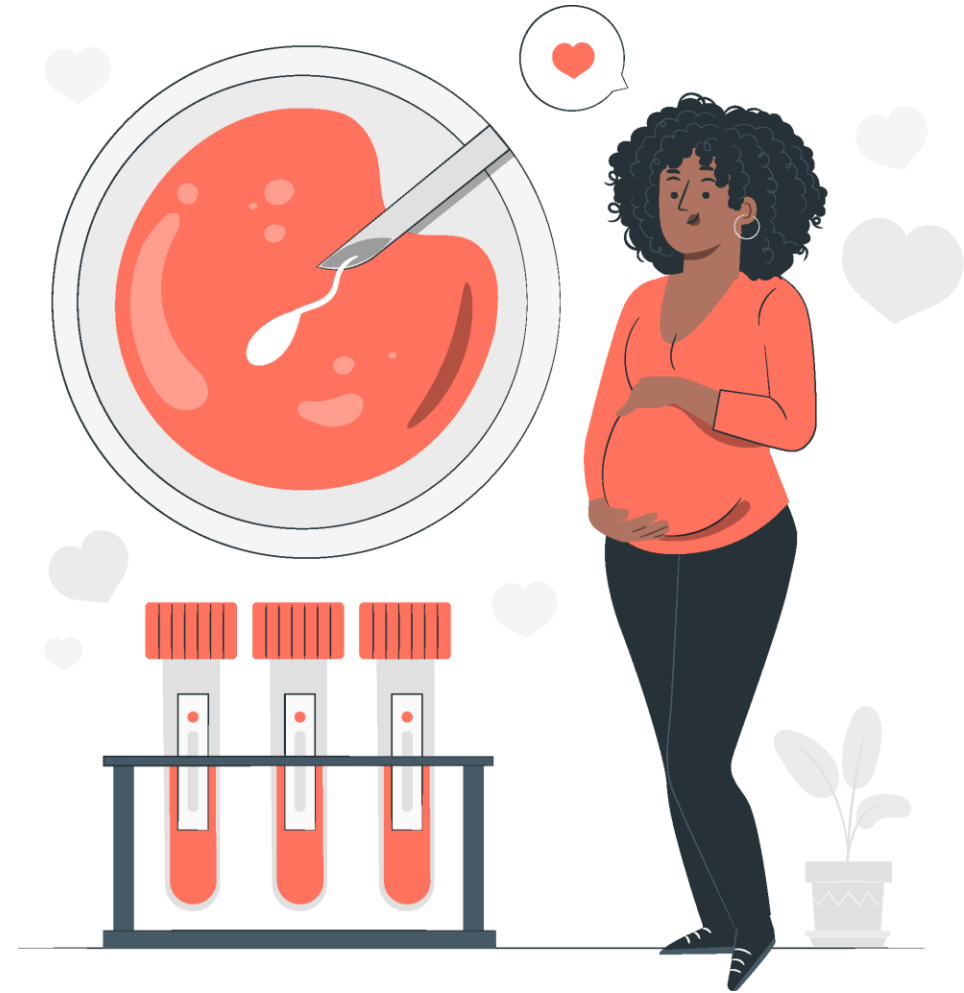
Risks Associated with Donating Eggs

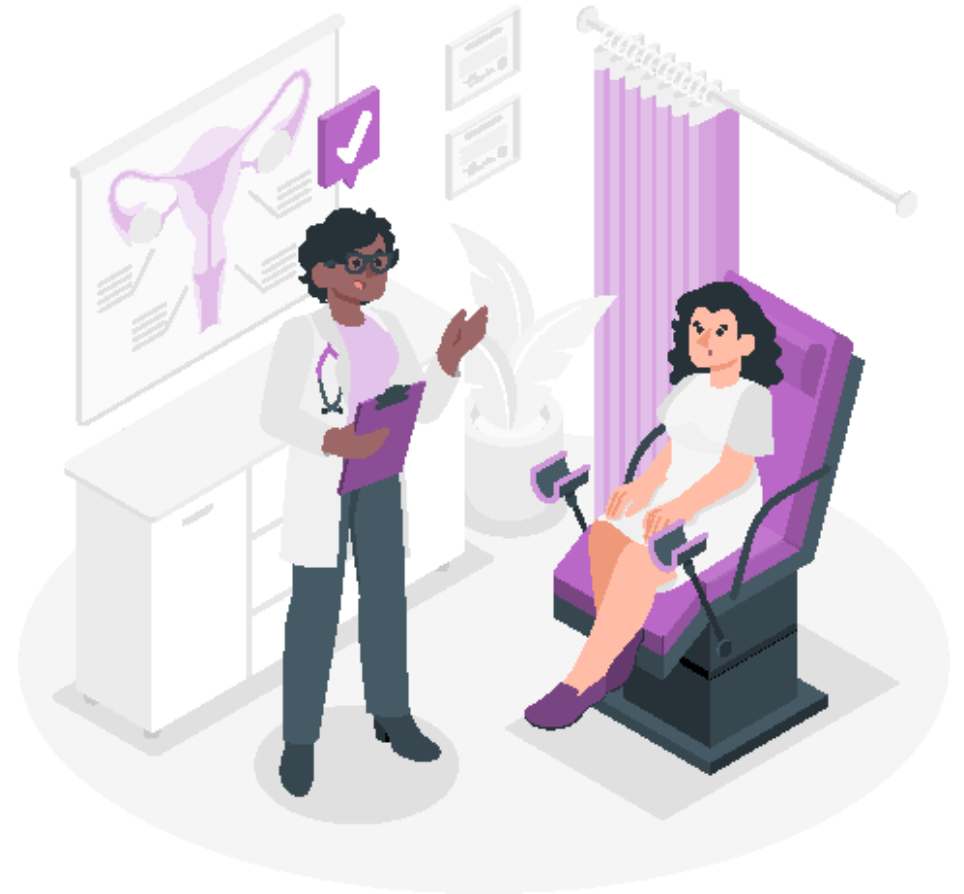
Risk of Pregnancy

Fertile individuals who donate their eggs are at an increased risk of becoming pregnant during the egg retrieval cycle. The use of reproductive medicines may make traditional chemical birth control methods ineffective. To reduce this risk, barrier contraception or abstinence are usually advised instead.



Debunking Myths About Future Fertility

A prevalent misperception regarding egg donation is that it could have an adverse effect on a woman's ability to conceive in the future. This idea, however, is not supported by science. Usually, 10 to 15 eggs are donated for each donation. A woman would only contribute a small portion of her initial egg supply—roughly 300,000–500,000 eggs at puberty—even if she donated six times.
